

**The University of Sussex** is located at Falmer, on the outskirts of Brighton, within easy reach of London and major international airports (Gatwick and Heathrow). The University also has excellent rail links and has easy access to the main south coast ports. We have outlined here the various travel options available to visitors, and for further help you will also find useful contact numbers on the back of this leaflet.

**Train**  
Falmer station is directly opposite the University campus. Pedestrian access is through a subway under the A27 - follow signs for the University of Sussex (University of Brighton has a small campus at Falmer too).  
Falmer station is on the line between Brighton and Lewes, about eight minutes travel in each direction. It is well served, with four trains an hour during the day time. Visitors travelling via London and the west should take a train to Brighton and change there for Falmer. The journey time from London to Brighton is just under an hour. You can also change at Lewes for Falmer, if you are coming from the east.

**Taxi**  
Taxis are available at both Brighton and Lewes train stations and at many places in the centre of Brighton. It is about four miles (six kilometres) from central Brighton to Falmer. (There is no taxi service at Falmer Station itself.) It is often quicker to catch the train direct to Falmer from Brighton or Lewes.

**Car**  
The University is at Falmer on the A27 between Brighton and Lewes, about four miles (six kilometres) from the centre of Brighton. Visitors from London and the north should take the M23/A23 road towards Brighton. Before entering the centre of Brighton, join the A27 eastbound signposted Lewes. Drivers from the east or west take the A27 direct to the University. (Please follow signs for University of Sussex on the north side of the A27; University of Brighton also has a small campus at Falmer on the south side.)

**Parking**  
If you are bringing a motor vehicle onto the University campus you must complete a conference car parking permit and display it in your windscreen. Car parking charges are in effect between 09.00 and 17.00 hours Monday to Friday, and only the display of an official conference car parking permit will ensure that you do not have to purchase a pay and display ticket. You may park in any car park on campus - permits are available from your conference organiser.

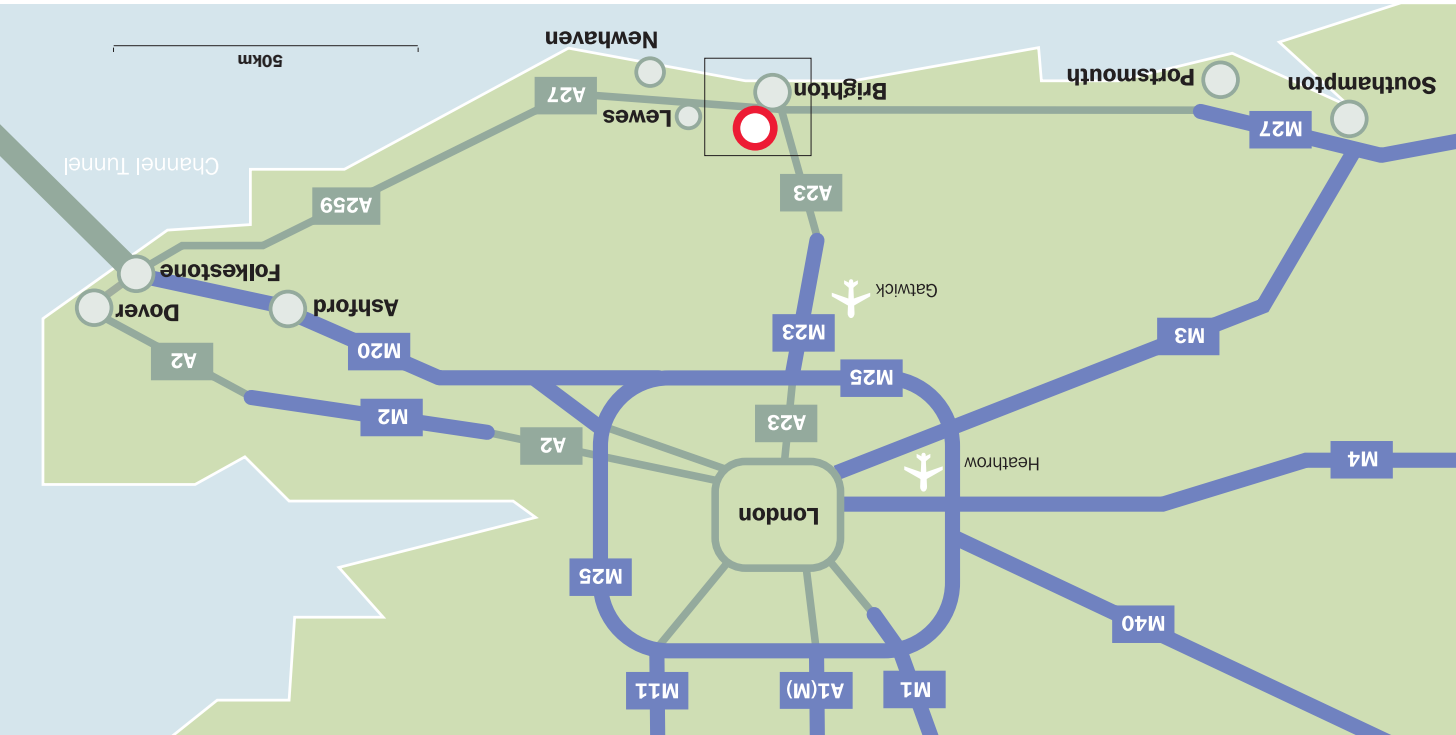
**Coach**  
Coaches to Brighton depart from London Victoria Coach Station and arrive at Pool Valley in the centre of the city. Services are every hour during the day and take about two hours. Coaches also run to Brighton from Gatwick and Heathrow. From Pool Valley you need to walk 100 metres to the Old Steine where you can catch a bus direct to the University (see Local Bus section), or you can take a taxi.

**Local Bus**  
Bus numbers 25, 25A, 25B and 25C run between the centre of Brighton and the University, bringing you directly onto campus. These buses can be caught from the Old Steine in Brighton, and the 25 and 25A can also be caught at Churchill Square. In addition, bus numbers 28, 28X and 729 go from the Old Steine and stop right outside the University campus on their way to Lewes and beyond. Travel time is about 20-30 minutes.

**Arriving in England**  
London Gatwick is much closer to the University of Sussex than London Heathrow and has better transport links to the campus. From Gatwick simply take the train to Brighton or Lewes and change for Falmer (see Train section). From Heathrow take the underground to Victoria train station for trains to Brighton. Coaches also run from both Gatwick and Heathrow to Brighton. This is the best option from Heathrow if you have lots of luggage. Check the National Express website for details (www.nationalexpress.com).

**Eurostar**  
Eurostar operates train services from continental Europe via the Channel Tunnel. From the London Waterloo terminal take the underground or bus to Victoria train station and take the train to Brighton.

**See**  
Passenger ferries operate between Dieppe in France and Newhaven, which then has a direct link to Falmer. From Portsmouth or Southampton, take the train to Brighton and change for Falmer. From any other port, take the train to London and travel from Victoria train station via Brighton.
