



## JOURNAL EDITORS IN HIGHER EDUCATION RESEARCH

The Society for Research into Higher Education (SRHE) is an independent and self-supporting UK-based international learned society concerned to advance understanding of higher education through the insights, perspectives and knowledge offered by systematic research and scholarship. The Society is the leading international society in the field, as to both the support and the dissemination of research into higher education.

**Editorial Vacancies:** The Society is seeking applications for Editors for two of its main journals. Each of these positions offers an outstanding opportunity for an individual or an editorial team of colleagues to take on a pivotal role in the field of higher education.

Both Journals are published by T&F Informa UK Ltd on behalf of the Society and the publishers provide full training and support in the use of the online systems in place for each journal.

Editors have individual responsibility for initiating and overseeing publications to their completion, ensuring the highest standards and adherence to publication timetables. Editors will be members of, and will be supported by, the Society's Publications Committee, which oversees all SRHE publications. Applicants will have extensive knowledge of national and international higher education issues and a personal publications record.



### Studies in Higher Education

An editor or editorial group is sought for this prestigious and influential journal which publishes research-based empirical, reflective and synoptic articles dealing with higher education, approached from any perspective or discipline. It places particular emphasis on education as practice, with a view to influencing its development. *Studies* is currently published 8 times per year.. This journal has a high ISI ranking and is the preferred and most respected publication for academics and researchers in this field.

The editorial position is supported by a generous stipend for the editorial services provided.

### Research into Higher Education Abstracts

This journal exists to propagate knowledge about, and encourage discussion of, significant research into higher education. It provides a regular survey of international periodicals relevant to the theory and practice of higher education and also offers a selective coverage of books and monographs. *RHEA* includes over 750 abstracts per annum and is published 3 times. The Journal is taken by all the Society's members worldwide as well as being available on subscription. The editorial position is supported by an honorarium.

Both appointments will be for a period of three years, renewable subject to mutual agreement. The effective date of these appointments will be 1 January 2012 but the Society wishes to have a period of handover with the current editors, both of whom are standing down after many very successful years.
